

B2 Phrasal Verbs Worksheet 2

1. Find Out (Separable)

Definition: to discover information

Formal alternative: discover

Examples:

- I found out the truth yesterday.
 - I found the truth out yesterday.
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2. Give Up (Separable)

Definition: to stop doing something

Formal alternative: quit

Examples:

- He gave up smoking last year.
 - He gave smoking up last year.

3. Hand In (Separable)

Definition: to submit work or documents

Formal alternative: submit

Examples:

- She handed in her assignment.
 - She handed her assignment in.
-

4. Leave Out (Separable)

Definition: to omit something

Formal alternative: omit

Examples:

- You left out an important detail.
 - You left an important detail out.
-

5. Sort Out (Separable)

Definition: to resolve or organize

Formal alternative: resolve

Examples:

- We need to sort out this problem.
 - We need to sort this problem out.
-

6. Take Up (Separable)

Definition: to begin a hobby or activity

Formal alternative: start

Examples:

- She took up photography.
 - She took photography up.
-

7. Put Forward (Separable)

Definition: to propose an idea

Formal alternative: propose

Examples:

- He put forward an interesting suggestion.
 - He put the suggestion forward.
-

8. Bring Back (Separable)

Definition: to restore or reintroduce

Formal alternative: restore

Examples:

- The company brought back the old logo.
 - The company brought the old logo back.
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9. Break Down (Inseparable)

Definition: to stop functioning

Formal alternative: malfunction

Example:

- My car broke down on the way home.
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10. Come Across (Inseparable)

Definition: to find by chance

Formal alternative: encounter

Example:

- I came across an interesting article online.
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11. Get Over (Inseparable)

Definition: to recover from something

Formal alternative: recover from

Example:

- It took her months to get over the disappointment.

12. Look After (Inseparable)

Definition: to take care of

Formal alternative: care for

Example:

- She looks after her elderly parents.
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13. Look Down On (Inseparable)

Definition: to consider someone inferior

Formal alternative: despise

Example:

- Some people look down on manual workers.
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14. Put Up With (Inseparable)

Definition: to tolerate

Formal alternative: tolerate

Example:

- I can't put up with that noise anymore.
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15. Get Through (Inseparable)

Definition: to successfully complete

Formal alternative: complete

Example:

- We got through a lot of work today.
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16. Go Ahead With (Inseparable)

Definition: to proceed with a plan

Formal alternative: proceed with

Example:

- They decided to go ahead with the project.

17. Live Up To (Inseparable)

Definition: to meet expectations

Formal alternative: fulfil

Example:

- The film lived up to my expectations.

18. Run Out Of (Inseparable)

Definition: to have no more of something

Formal alternative: exhaust

Example:

- We've run out of milk.

19. Get Away With (Inseparable)

Definition: to avoid punishment

Formal alternative: evade punishment for

Example:

- He got away with cheating on the test.

20. Catch Up With (Inseparable)

Definition: to reach the same level as someone

Formal alternative: match

Example:

- She worked hard to catch up with her classmates.
